October

Danforth Scholars Program at Washington University in St. Louis-offers full or partial tuition scholarships, renewed each year. Students must be nominated by an individual who has substantive Knowledge of the student's accomplishments. Complete the ERHS Scholarship Nomination Form and return to your counselor by **October 10, 2005**.

William & Mary College Scholars-student must be ranked in the upper 1% of class, scored a 1450+ on the SAT. ERHS can nominate **one** student. Complete the ERHS Scholarship Nomination Form and return to your counselor by **October 14, 2005**.

Jefferson Scholars Foundation-student must possess exceptional ability in leadership and scholarship and show promise in making a significant contribution to the UV community. ERHS can nominate **one** student for the scholarship. Complete the ERHS Scholarship Nomination Form and return to your counselor by **October 15, 2005**.

Emory Scholars Program-spans four years from two-thirds to full tuition, room, board and fees. ERHS can nominate up to four seniors with outstanding academic achievement, possess extraordinary personal qualities, and have significant contributions to their class, school and community. Complete the ERHS Scholarship Nomination Form and return to your counselor by **October 14, 2005**.

NC State Centennial Scholarship-students must be interested in the fields of engineering, business management, chemistry, polymer chemistry, international studies, design apparel, sourcing, fashion merchandising or retail management. ERHS can nominate two students. Complete the ERHS Scholarship Nomination Form and return to your counselor by **October 14, 2005**.

Complete the ERHS Scholarship Nomination Form and return to your counselor. **Deadline November 4, 2005**.

SAE Engineering Scholarship-applicants must be a high school senior at the time of application (9/1-12/1/05), intend to earn a degree in engineering or a related science, be a citizen of the United States, meet minimum requirements of GPA, SAT/ACT. Boston University's Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Scholarship Competition-full tuition awards for academically gifted students with proven leadership abilities and strong commitment to social justice and community involvement. 3.5 GPA in demanding courses, top 10% of class, SAT score of 1250 or higher (CR & MATH) 600 or higher on writing. Boston University Trustee Scholarship Competition-recognizes outstanding academic performances and leadership ability, renewable scholarship for full tuition and Undergraduate Student Fee. Students must have a 3.50 GPA or better, ranked in the top 5% of class, SAT score of 1400 or higher on CR and M section and 700 or higher on WR. Ron Brown Scholar Program-to academically talented, highly motivated African American students who are seniors in high school this year (graduating in 2006) and plan to pursue undergraduate degrees full-time.
